2. Crime issues of particular note

The following list shows some of the crimes that have occurred in the previous month in your area.

- A considerable decrease in vehicle related crime across all Wards last month with 16 reported cases compared to March which saw figures rise to at least 36 reported cases that we know of. During May our community patrols will once again continue to deliver high visibility reassurance to members of the public. Any intelligence re this issue can be submitted by calling Crime Stoppers 0800 555 111 or Humberside Police 101.
- 17 shop thefts across all Wards last month, one of which involves known female suspect with male partner enter Heron Frozen Foods, Hessle, and select various food items from the shelves before exiting the store without offering payment. Following extensive enquiries with CCTV and the store both persons are arrested for the offences.
- 15 reported residential burglaries across all Wards during April some of which involved entry to outbuildings such as sheds and garages. Please remember to lock and secure all outbuildings and where possible use security lighting/alarms. During May our community policing teams will continue to deliver high visibility reassurance to all Wards in an attempt to reduce these offences.
- 9 reported cases of anti-social behaviour across all Wards last month, some of which involve damage to play equipment of a park in the Dale Ward along with graffiti to a skate park South Hunsley and damage to properties fencing in the Hessle Ward.

3. Community Priorities

The Neighbourhood Policing Team meet regularly with partners to ensure we have a multi-agency approach to local issues, individuals and problem solving. These meetings are regularly attended by partners including Humberside Fire and Rescue Service, Youth and Family Support, Housing Officers, Environmental Health and the East Riding Anti-Social Behaviour Team. We share information and resources to deal with local neighbourhood issues, in particular, those identified as causing the most harm in the community.

- Operation **Gallant** continues to run this month and we will be performing high visibility patrols around any hotspot locations. We will continue to target offenders and support victims of this impact crime. Please visit your local team and the numerous surgeries throughout the month or visit the local station for more information on how we are targeting hotspots this month.
- Throughout May 2019 our community patrols will continue to deliver high visibility reassurance to deter offences of **Anti-social behaviour**. We are continuing to work with partners of both retail and licensed premises to solve the issue of anti- social behaviour. We are also keen to recruit any volunteer schemes with regard to youth engagement, there are some positive developments and we will look to support such schemes. 4. Crime Reduction Advice

This month's message is about Vehicle Crime Reduction:

Check Your Fob has done its Job! Don't assume your vehicle is secure – always check doors are locked before you walk away and recheck before you settle down for the night. Consider a faraday pouch to keep your keys/fob safe and never leave them in range of your vehicle – think about keeping them at the other side of the house.

Please remove all valuables from vehicle when left unattended and leave the glove-box open and empty to reduce the opportunity of becoming a victim.



5. Crime Prevention Advice

Anti-social behaviour covers a wide range of unacceptable activity that causes harm to an individual, to their community or to their environment. This could be an action by someone else that leaves you feeling alarmed, harassed or distressed. It also includes fear of crime or concern for public safety, public disorder or public nuisance.

Examples of anti-social behaviour include:

- Nuisance, rowdy or inconsiderate neighbours
- Vandalism, graffiti and fly-posting
- Street drinking
- Environmental damage including littering, dumping of rubbish and abandonment of cars
- Prostitution related activity
- Begging and vagrancy
- Fireworks misuse
- Inconsiderate or inappropriate use of vehicles

The police, local authorities and other community safety partner agencies, such as Fire & Rescue and social housing landlords, all have a responsibility to deal with anti-social behaviour and to help people who are suffering from it. If you are experiencing problems with anti-social behaviour, or have any concerns about it, or other community safety issues, you should contact your local council or call the non-emergency number, 101. In an emergency, call 999.

8. Useful information

Spring is finally here, time to get into the garden or a visit to the allotment. Here is some practical, simple advice to beat the Garden Thief/Shed Burglar:

SHEDUCATION

Secure the access to your shed or garage by locking gates and using thorny bushes next to walls and fences.

Have you visibly marked the contents of your shed? Make a note of serial numbers and photograph valuable plants and ornaments.

External security lights which are activated by movement are a useful deterrent.

Doors of sheds require attention. Use strong hasp/staples and close shackled padlocks. Up and over garage doors supplied with standard lock fittings should also be fitted with a padlock or lockable bolt. Windows should be secured with locks or grilles.

Use coach bolts or non-return screws to secure door hinges.

Chain cycles, mowers, ladders and tools to a strong anchorage point.

Alarms for sheds and garages are available for under £20 at most DIY stores, catalogue shops and builders merchants.

Exactly what insurance cover do you have? Check that your household policy covers you for theft from your garden and outbuildings.

Burglaries of sheds and garages are growing! The police together with Neighbourhood Watch Groups are asking for your help. The value of property in sheds and garages is more than people think. Thieves are targeting them for power tools, cycle and sports equipment. Hand tools are stolen and used to break into homes. So let's weed out these thieves by getting some **sheducation!**
