The SVA Committee continues to work hard on your behalf. We are hoping to increase our membership numbers this year and the percentage of our residents joining in. Please do read the article providing background information about SVA to see just what our role is in the village – and what is in it for you! We thank you if your £2 membership has been paid, gently remind you if you've forgotten and hope that non-members will be persuaded to join us.

Thank you to all the members and non-members who attended our AGM. Once the business was over, we were heartily entertained by Paul Atkinson from "Kingston Veterinary Group", who regaled us with very interesting and light hearted anecdotes concerning the animals in his care.

The Heritage Centre', based in the old Library near the pond, is an exciting new project and eventually it is hoped that this will house local history and be manned by villagers. The SVA has pledged £650, which has been matched by the Parish Council, to allow the project to proceed until funding can be found to sustain it.

Our next village entry sign has been commissioned and funded by Mr. and Mrs. J. Godber, the Parish Council and the SVA. We extend our thanks to Jane and John Godber for very generously donating the proceeds of their Swanland Festival Youth Theatre evening to this venture. Our thanks to the Parish Council for their financial support too. We work closely with Geoff Chapman the Chairman and his committee and greatly value their ongoing commitment to the SVA. Thank you to all the many volunteers who spend their spare time making sure that Swanland continues to be a village of which we can all be proud. Read on how!



Swanland Village Association –

A bit of background information as to who we are and what we do!

First there was someone like YOU – and there still is! Then there is closest family and friends. After that you may think

about your house and job. But does the buck stop there? Do we see ourselves as individuals all doing just our own things in solitary confinement?

Well we should hope the answer to the above is "No". But how do we go about making that answer become "No"? Well, that is just the sort of question Swanland villagers were thinking about many years ago in 1989. They recognised that together in the village they needed to become a community, with a desire to get to know each other, help each other, share common interests and do things collectively to make the village the way they wanted it to be.

It was thoughts like that led to the creation of a local village association to cater for the likely needs of all ages and provide those finishing touches to the activities, appearance and reputation of our village that otherwise would just not happen.

So the association was born and it has achieved a lot since. Today, it organises and/or supports many local events in the village. The "Swanland Live Shows" and "Swanland Screen" for example are dependent on the Swanland Village Association for financial support and organisation. It is giving support as well to the establishment of the new Swanland Heritage Centre. It provides advice on local wildlife. It takes an active role in maintaining the appearance and condition of the village pond, which requires ongoing work to ensure that the water quality is maintained at a level that is required. It helps to finance sub-groups and fundraising for the benefit of the whole of Swanland. It also encourages local events such as Swanland Open Gardens and Swanland Festival.

The association helps to enhance the appearance of the village. It arranges rotas for maintaining and watering bulbs, flowers, planters and tubs for year round displays. There is also a litter picking rota to make our streets look better. For the attractive signs on entering the village – thank the village association!

The other important aspect of the association is that of communication. It liaises with the Swanland Parish Council and is in touch with the Swanland Village Hall and Playing Field Association. It is responsible for an invaluable web site providing information on any non-profit making Swanland activities and organisations that wish to be included (see www.swanland.info). It also produces

the newsletter that you are reading now, which comes out three times per year and is delivered to every household in the village. On top of that it provides welcome and information packs for new Swanland residents. (See page 18 for details.)

So, do we still all see ourselves as individuals all doing just our own things by ourselves? We hope not and that as many people as possible will want to contribute or join in one way or another. The SVA can always do even better with your help and ideas. We would like as many people as possible to become members or show an interest or participate in one or more of the many things we do. If there is nothing about the association that currently interests you, we want to know what would – and might even be able to help you set it up, whatever it is.

It is YOUR village, remember. We believe that the association does improve the lifestyle of the village and its reputation to others. SVA Membership Report – Spring 2013

The paid up membership of the association totalled 385 in 2012, compared with 419 at the end of 2011. At the end of February 2013 the paid up membership was 213. This included 142 people paying by standing order and 71 paying by cash or cheque. More people are paying by standing

order which is good. Sadly, there has been a disappointing reduction in those paying promptly by cash or cheque. Could this be due to the bad weather keeping people at home?

Membership cards have been issued to those who have already paid, unless you have indicated that you do not need them. If you have not received yours, please inform the membership secretary.

The current subscription is still £2 per member per year. This is a very small sum of money in 2013 terms. If you do wish to give more you can increase your standing order or give donations. We would very much like to increase the membership, not just for the money but to give a better representation of our community. Being a member does not make any demands upon villagers though we would be happy to involve you in our activities. In fact, you may like to place demands on us! Please take a look at the previous article, which provides some useful background information regarding the association. Thanks to those who have paid already and to those who pay by standing order.

For the Swanland Live Shows supported by the SVA, SVA members get a £1 discount on ticket prices. When membership only costs £2 per annum, this has to be fantastic value. Attend two shows and you have saved your membership fees.

The membership year runs from 1st January to 31st December, subscriptions for this year have been taken since the AGM last November. If you pay your membership by cash or cheque and have not done so since November, please renew your membership now. A joining/rejoining form is on the back page of this newsletter. Photocopies or just hand-written copies are acceptable. You can pay any committee member or in a sealed envelope to Kerry at Swanland Post Office. There is a supply of envelopes in the Post Office for joining or renewing. You can also join up at Swanland Live Show and Swanland Screen events. Contact the membership secretary for a standing order form if you wish to pay by standing order. We are considering possible additional simple ways of making payment easy in the future. Please look out for us.

Swanland Neighbourhood Watch Update

Swanland NHW is helping Jessica Watts, Police Community Support Officer for Swanland, in a new crime prevention/detection scheme. Incident Report Cards, being distributed to every household, can be used to report suspicious or unusual activities.

Boxes for returning the cards and replacement cards can be found at Swanland Nurseries, McColls and the Post Office. Responses will be collected weekly.

NHW street co-ordinators are needed for: Chantry Way/East, Todds Close, Humberdale Close, Greenstiles Lane, Styles Croft, Greenacres, Woodside, Easonby Close, Northdale Park, Waudby View, The Green, Crowther Way/Close, Queensbury Way, Dale Close/Road, West Leys Road and Kemp Road. They report crimes and anti-social behaviour and keep neighbours informed about local issues. All are welcome to attend NHW meetings in February, June and October, usually with a Humberside Police representative present.

Swanland Heritage Centre

- A new venture for Swanland

The provision of a heritage centre in Swanland will bring together many local archives from the past history of our village, some of which might otherwise be lost or forgotten. It aims to provide a permanent home near the pond at the old "Pond Studio" that will be open to the public.

The Swanland Village Association and Swanland Parish Council have stepped in and each has agreed to pay six months' rent for the studio, where all the archival material for the proposed new Heritage Centre is currently just being stored. The Steering Group is busily compiling lists of people interested in helping with this project, either to serve on the Management Committee or to man the Centre for a couple of hours from time to time.

They are currently awaiting a response to an ongoing grant application which would then enable the Centre to be opened. With this in view, it has been decided to call an Inaugural Meeting to which anyone interested is invited. It will be held at **7.30 pm on Wednesday 20th March** in the upstairs room at the Village Hall, so please come along to lend your support.

Swanland Wildlife Information & Advice Service (SWIAS) News

Sightings so far this winter have included a Waxwing and Brambling and a small flock of Redwings and Fieldfares. All are winter visitors from Eastern Europe. You may like to look and listen for blue tits and long tail tits nest building, song

thrushes, dunnocks and chaffinches singing sweetly and house sparrow flocks squabbling noisily! You may also hear tawny owls calling nightly as their breeding season continues. Look out for primroses and wood anemones as they begin flowering.

May we give some wildlife advice? At the end of March PLEASE stop feeding peanuts to birds as tit chicks will choke on them. They can only swallow soft food!

Swanland Show



Following our own and required safety inspections various maintenance tasks need to be undertaken to spruce up the park and field area. These are mainly cleaning, sanding, weeding and painting. We would like to arrange a community clean up and picnic day

Swanland Football Club (FC)



The Christmas holidays are over, January is behind us, the nights are getting lighter and our thoughts turn to spring – once again being able to venture to the playing fields in fewer than 4 layers of clothing.

Swanland football club continues to grow since it was established six years ago. We are also starting to think about our plans for next season and how we will continue to develop as a club whilst implementing the important and welcome changes to junior football that have recently been mandated by the Football Association. These changes have been designed to increase participation, reduce the premature emphasis on competition and encourage young player development and are therefore fully consistent with the principles upon which our club was founded.

We have already worked with the Playing Fields Association to alter the configuration of the football pitches so that we can accommodate 7 a side, 11 a side and the newly introduced 9 a side matches. Under the new arrangements, the younger age groups will begin to play 4 a side and 5 a side games so we are having further discussions with the Playing Fields Association to see how this can best be accommodated.

More importantly and in the spirit of the FA's changes, we are moving away from age banded training groups for younger players and are establishing an Academy that is open to boys and girls aged 5 to 8. We do, of course, need to keep finding new young players who want to join the club. Anyone who is interested can contact Chris O'Neill on 07787 510877 for more information.

For reasons beyond our control, getting information about the club direct to parents of potential players has become more difficult of late.
