A hosepipe is located at the side of Christ Church, access by combination padlock code 1693. This hose will reach the 2 tubs at the War Memorial, 3 hayracks on the Heritage Centre railings, the new hayracks on the corner of the pond, the WI box and the 4 tubs outside the church. When watering the hayracks on the Village Hall railings, you will now find a tap to the left of the Main Entrance Door outside. This has the same combination lock code 1693. We suggest you use watering cans although there may be the option of a hose if this proves possible. Please turn off the water and rewind the hose after use. Watering cans are also available.

A water tap and can is available at the rear of Ewan's Mere Cottage (attached to Mere House). This will water the hayrack on the wall of Ewan's Mere Cottage. Do NOT bother watering the sycamore bed near the bus stop.

At the western end of the pond, a hosepipe at Mere Flats will water the adjacent flowerbeds and the tubs near the bowling club & the hayrack on the Swan signpost.

Finally, evening watering is better, if possible, than daytime in the hot sun. Recent rain does not necessarily mean we don't have to water.
